
MILLS TOWN

Welcome to the Executive City Profile for Mills town. In this document you will find Demographic, Economic, and Housing data from the U.S. Census Bureau. This document uses data from the 2010 U.S. Census, the 2010 Five-Year American Community Survey (ACS), and the most recent 2019 Five-Year ACS to explore local trends in the population, economy, and housing market of Mills town.

DEMOGRAPHICS

Population

Census population estimates from 2000 to 2020 are displayed below and indicate that the population of Mills town increased by 17.8 percent from 3,461 persons in 2010 to 4,077 persons in 2020.




Population By Race And Ethnicity

In Mills town, according to the 2010 Five-Year ACS, the White racial population represented the largest share of the total population, accounting for 94.0 percent of the total population, or 3,252 people. By 2019, the White population had increased by 2.9 percentage points and accounted for 96.9 percent of the total population. In Mills town, according to the 2019 Five-Year ACS, the largest cohort of population by race was still the White population, accounting for 96.9 percent of the total population in 2019, or 3,799 persons. The fastest growing racial population in Mills town was the White population, which increased by 2.9 percent from 94.0 percent of the total population in 2010 to 96.9 percent in 2019.




Hispanic Population




Population By Age

In Mills town, according to the 2010 Census, the 35 to 54 age cohort represented the largest share of the total population, accounting for 27.1 percent of the total population, or 937 people. By 2019, the 35 to 54 population had decreased by 3.1 percentage points and accounted for 24.0 percent of the total population. In Mills town, according to the 2019 Five-Year ACS, the largest cohort of population by age was still the 35 to 54 population, accounting for 24.0 percent of the total population in 2019, or 939 persons. The fastest growing age cohort in Mills town was the 65 and over population, which increased by 4.5 percent from 14.3 percent of the total population in 2010 to 18.8 percent in 2019.


Elderly Population By Age

The elderly population is further explored below. In 2019 those aged 65 to 66 accounted for 14.2 percent of the elderly population, while those aged 67 to 69 accounted for an additional 16.3 percent. The oldest cohort in Mills town, those aged 85 and older, accounted for 15.9 percent of the elderly population in 2019.


Disability By Age

The disability rate for females was 25.6 percent in 2019, compared to 28.9 percent for males. The disability rate tends to grow precipitously higher with age, with 59.2 percent of those over 75 experiencing a disability in 2019. Overall, the disability rate in Mills town was 27.3 in 2019.






Poverty By Age

In 2019, an estimated 10.7 percent of the population in Mills town, or 406 people, were living in poverty, compared to 18.4 percent living in poverty in 2000. In 2019, some 16.1 percent of those in poverty were under age 6 and 8.1 percent were 65 or older. This compares to an overall statewide poverty rate of 9.9 percent and a nationwide poverty rate of 12.3 percent.




Educational Attainment

In 2019, 89.8 percent of households had a high school education or greater, including 48.3 percent with a high school diploma or equivalent, 35.3 percent with some college, 4 percent with a Bachelor Degree, and 2.2 percent with a graduate or professional degree. In comparison, in 2010, 12.7 percent of households in Mills town had less than a high school education, while 40.6 percent had a high school diploma or equivalent and 5.6 percent had a Bachelors Degree.


Census Unemployment Estimates

In 2019, 1,864 people were in the labor force, including 1,708 employed and 156 unemployed people. The unemployment rate for Mills town was estimated at 8.4 percent in 2019.


Employment By Industry



HOUSING

Housing Units By Type

In 2010, there were 1,791 housing units, compared with 1,967 in 2019. Single-family units accounted for 41.3 percent of units in 2019, compared to 42.5 percent in 2010. Apartment units accounted for 5.5 percent in 2019, compared to 3.5 percent in 2010.



Housing Units By Tenure

In 2019, there were 1,967 housing units in Mills town, of which 1,753 were occupied and 214 were vacant. Of the vacant housing units, 70.9 percent were owner-occupied, and 29.1 percent were renter-occupied.



Households By Income

In Mills town, according to the 2010 Five-Year ACS, the largest cohort of households by income were those making \$25,000 to \$34,999, accounting for 21.1 percent of all households in 2010, or 362 households. In comparison, the smallest cohort of households by income in Mills town in 2010 were those making \$100,000 or More, representing 5.4 percent of all households. Between 2010 and the 2019 Five-Year ACS, the share of households making \$25,000 to \$34,999 in Mills town decreased by 7.2 percentage points and accounted for 13.9 percent of all households in 2019. According to the 2019 Five-Year ACS, the largest cohort of households by income in Mills town was the \$50,000 to \$74,999 cohort, accounting for 19.6 percent of the total households in 2019, or 344 households. The fastest growing cohort of households by income between 2010 and 2019 was those making \$100,000 or More, which increased by 5.9 percent from 5.4 percent of all households in 2010 to 11.3 percent in 2019.




Households By Household Size



Households By Year Home Built

In Mills town, according to the 2010 Five-Year ACS, the largest cohort of households by year built were those built in 1970 to 1979, accounting for 38.1 percent of all households in 2010, or 653 households. In comparison, the smallest cohort of households by year built in Mills town in 2010 were those built in 1950 to 1959, representing 3.7 percent of all households. Between 2010 and the 2019 Five-Year ACS, the share of households built in 1970 to 1979 in Mills town decreased by 17.8 percentage points and accounted for 20.3 percent of all households in 2019. According to the 2019 Five-Year ACS, the largest cohort of households by year built in Mills town was still the 1970 to 1979 cohort, accounting for 20.3 percent of the total households in 2019, or 356 households. The fastest growing cohort of households by year built between 2010 and 2019 was those built in 1950 to 1959, which increased by 15.5 percent from 3.7 percent of all households in 2010 to 19.2 percent in 2019.



Census Vacancy Rate

In 2019 the Owner-Occupied For Sale vacancy rate was 1.0% percent, while the Rental Unit vacancy rate was 3.2% percent in Mills town.





Cost Burden - Total

In Mills town, according to the 2010 Five-Year ACS, the largest cohort of households by presence of cost burden were those experiencing No Cost Burden, accounting for 66.6 percent of all households in 2010, or 1,141 households. In comparison, the smallest cohort of households by presence of cost burden in Mills town in 2010 were those experiencing Severe Cost Burden, representing 0.9 percent of all households. Between 2010 and the 2019 Five-Year ACS, the share of households experiencing No Cost Burden in Mills town increased by 5.4 percentage points and accounted for 72.0 percent of all households in 2019. According to the 2019 Five-Year ACS, the largest cohort of households by presence of cost burden in Mills town was still the No Cost Burden cohort, accounting for 72.0 percent of the total households in 2019, or 1,263 households. The fastest growing cohort of households by presence of cost burden between 2010 and 2019 was those experiencing No Cost Burden, which increased by 5.4 percent from 66.6 percent of all households in 2010 to 72.0 percent in 2019.
